


Avoid Car Coasting And Have a Safe Drive

What is constine driving?

When you are driving a car downhill with either pressing the clutch or the gear stick in neutral or both at the same time
- it is known as coasting.











What happeas when coasting driving?

While coasting, your wheels remain disengaged from the engine, which leads to engine braking and requires the gears to slow down, which is nearly impossible.

Why is consting a bad driving technique?

Whether it is coasting downhill, coasting to stop or in any other circumstance. There are various reasons why coasting is bad -

- You can pick up high speed, and go way faster than you otherwise would.
- You face less control and you can't control the speed via engine braking, since the engine is not connected to the wheels.
- It becomes a challenging task to take a safe & steady line around the corner, and have lesser control if you have to cross the path of another road user or any other hazard. .

If you need to re-engage the gears to deal with the obstacles, then you will have less time to do that if you are not coasting.
